



Ilse Tant has been Chief Corporate Officer at Elia since January 2014. In this capacity she is responsible for the following departments: Legal, Public & Regulatory Affairs, Communications, HR, Corporate & Social Responsibility, Permits, Property, Environment & Facilities. She previously ran the "Seagrids" projects: Stevin, the new 380-kV high-voltage line in the coastal region; Nemo, an interconnection with the UK; and the Belgian Offshore Grid (BOG).

In 1997, she began her career as a lawyer at Stibbe, a Benelux law firm specialised in practising international commercial law. She joined Elia as Senior Legal Advisor in 2002, served as Senior Regulatory Business Analyst from 2007 to 2009, and was then placed in charge of Permits, Environment and Property as Senior Manager from 2009 to 2013.
