



Markus Berger has earned a degree in Civil Electromechanical Engineering from the Free University of Brussels (ULB), an Executive Master in Management and Business Administration from the Solvay Business School and a diploma from the Advanced Management Programme at INSEAD, based in Fontainebleau (France).

He began his career in 1988 at Laborelec, joining Electrabel in 1996 as a project engineer at one of the Regional Transmission Centres. Right from the start he has been a part of the organisation that would become Elia in June 2001, and he was in charge of maintenance services for southern Belgium from 2001 to 2002. After a stint as head of the Elia Sales and Customer Relations Department, he was appointed Chief Officer Grid Services and joined Elia's Executive Committee. In 2008, he also took over as managing director of Elia Engineering, a function that remains his responsibility to this day. In 2010, he assumed the role of Chief Officer Asset Management at Elia, and was designated Chief Executive Officer Elia Grid International in March 2014.

He also sits on the Investment Committee and the Board of Eurogrid International, the holding company created by Elia and Industry Fund Management for their joint acquisition of 50Hertz. Mr Berger is also a Board member of UWE (Union Wallonne des Entreprises), UWEL (Union Wallonne des Entreprises de Liège), Bemas, Ampacimon and the CIGRE association.
