# CACM Main Topics

Topic	Level	Description
Algorithm Development	EU	<i>Common set of requirements for the algorithm and its back-up systems design, some of these tasks will be performed in coordination with NEMOs</i>
Capacity Calculation	EU-Region	<i>The Coordinated Capacity Calculation processes and its enlargement towards a higher European Integration via the creation of a Common Grid Model methodology, the expansion of FB in Central Europe and the setting up of Coordinated Regional Security Initiatives</i>
ACER Monitoring	EU	<i>Determine the efficiency of market coupling and other processes</i>
Firmness	EU	<i>DAFD Proposal and Placement</i>
Market Coupling	EU-Region	<i>General DAMC and ID Continuous Trading market arrangements, fall-back solutions, local complementary auctions, etc.</i>
Market Design	EU	<i>High level market design aspects: Bidding Zones and their reconfiguration, Capacity Calculation Regions</i>
Governance	EU-Local	<i>NEMO designation aspects</i>
Re-dispatch & Countertrading	EU-Region	<i>XB Re-dispatch and Countertrading progressive integration framework plus its corresponding cost-sharing and standardisation monitoring</i>

# FCA Main Topics

Topic	Level	Description
Auction Rules	EU-Region	<i>Pan-EU Harmonised AR, Nomination Rules, regional specificities allowed in the HAR, etc.</i>
Capacity Calculation	EU-Region	<i>LT Capacity Calculation processes, Report on CC, establishment of the RSCIs, the CGM method, data inputs required for it (this section is quite linked to the corresponding CACM one)</i>
Firmness	EU-Region	<i>LT Rights Compensation Rules in case of curtailment</i>
Governance	EU	<i>Stakeholder involvement scheme</i>
Platforms	EU	<i>Creating the single allocation platform for LTRs</i>
Products	Region	<i>LTR products design definition</i>
Split Rules	Region	<i>XB IC capacity repartition between timeframes</i>
ACER Monitoring	EU	<i>Monitoring and Reporting to ACER</i>

# Suggested Organizational Principles

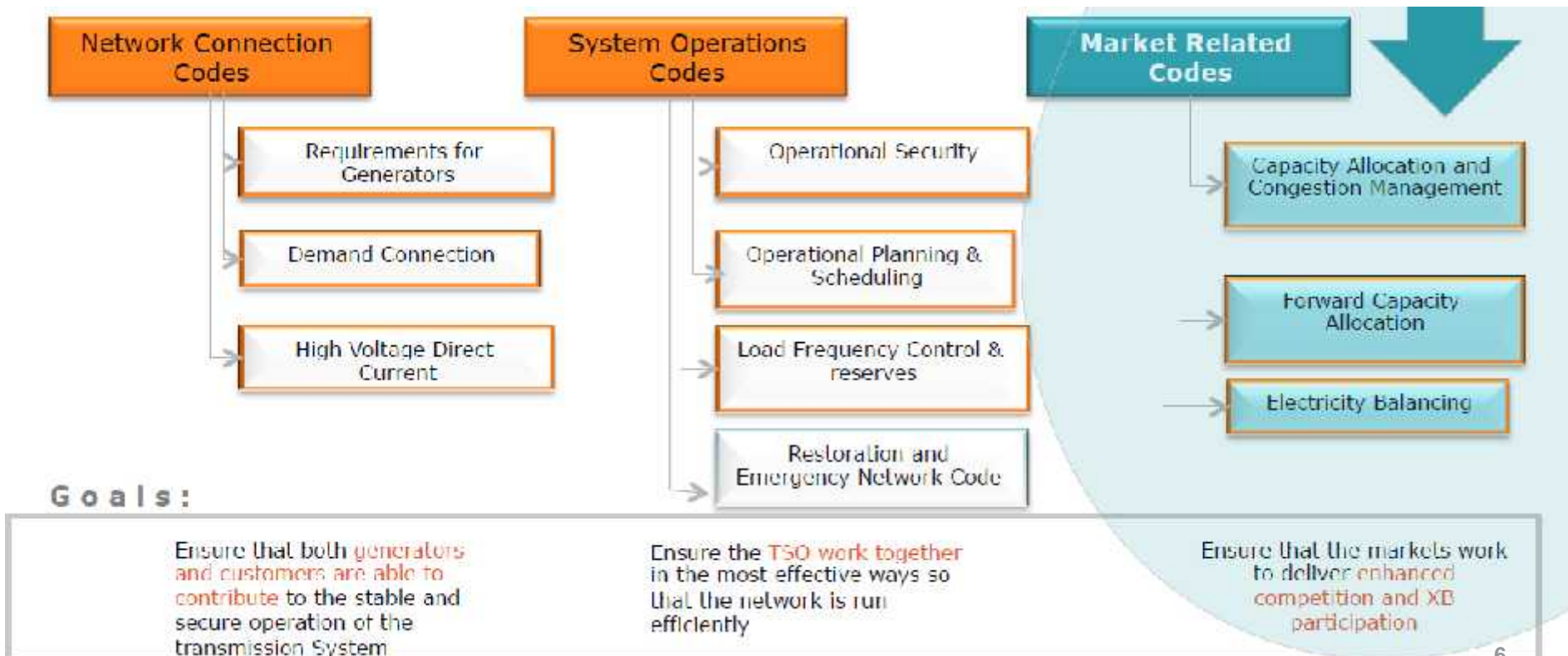
- To optimise impact, we would recommend that the main stakeholder involvement takes place at the most relevant level for each NC topic (EU, Regional, Belgium)
- **In this sense, via the prior Tables, we observe that most CACM-FCA Topics have a EU-Regional scope (which is also logical given their XB scope)**
- The UG EMD could serve as platform to report on the progress at non-Belgian levels, as it has been doing in the past
- **If stakeholders issues specifically linked to the BE context are not incorporated at the Regional/EU-level, Elia could try to pick them up via this forum**
- We would propose to maintain the same functioning for this forum as during the drafting stage of the CACM-FCA network codes
- **It is also to be highlighted that the processes foreseen in the NCs should also be respected, since now they will be soon into force (some are already: CACM)**
- If considered convenient later (tbd), it might be useful to set up an expert group discussing the actual amendments to BE docs, when “contents” are fully frozen
- **It would be really crucial for stakeholders to be involved and to provide as much clarity and feedback as it could be possible in the stakeholder fora “beyond BE”**

# Stakeholder Groups Involved

- Several stakeholder structures are being prepared as per CACM-FCA implementation (others are already in place)
- Some examples:
  - CACM Implementation issues will be dealt with by the CACM(-FCA) Stakeholder Group (Art.11)
  - Bidding Zones TF issues are also dealt with by the BZ TF Stakeholder Group of ENTSOE
  - FCA Implementation issues will be dealt with by the (CACM-)FCA Stakeholder Group (Art.5)

# CACM-FCA Inter-Related Topics

- Subjects carrying the same name/label in CACM and FCA are interrelated and should be considered in a coordinated way
- Other subjects are also linked and influence each other (example: Auction Rules and Split Rules of FCA have consequences in CACM; Market Design issues like Bidding Zones and CCRs in CACM, same as Governance, have an impact in FCA...)
